FBA Hears Talk on Architectural Conservation

The Flourtown Businesspersons Association meets on the fourth Thursday of each month and encourages all local business people to attend to keep informed about local happenings. Featured at each

meeting is a speaker with information of interest to many. The guest speaker at the May meeting was T. Scott Kreilick of Kreilick Conservation.

Kreilick is an architectural conservationist and

preservationist and he explained about his part in preservation of many local and familiar buildings and outdoor sculptures. His slide presentation included work on Philadelphia's City Hall, the Livezey House in Roxborough and the Allentown Liberty Bell which continues to be rung every year on the Fourth of July.

Kreilick, also a board member of the Springfield Township Historical Society also told of the efforts to save the Black Horse Inn. The Historical Society recently presented over 3,000 signatures, on petitions to save the Inn, to the commissioners of Springfield Township. The Black Horse Inn survives from 1744 and qualifies for inclusion on the National Register of Historic Places.

A banner will soon reach across Bethlehem Pike pleading for more support to the cause. More information
